On Sunday, 31 January, 2016, he peacefully passed away at home, surrounded by his family he loved so much. Calling hours were held on Thursday, 4 February. His 29 years of service in the US Navy took the Luzum family all over the world, with Jerry spending a lot of time away from home. He served two deployments to Viet Nam, serving with the Sea Bees on many different projects. As he rose through the ranks, his responsibilities grew and his leadership skills became quite evident. More travel, always taking care of his family and men and women. Never asked anybody to do a job that he wouldn't do himself. The organizational pyramid diagram from top to bottom existed only on paper for Jerry. He led by example and trusted his team to always do the right thing.

The dedication he had for always serving, especially veterans, was most evident with his work for our Chapter and MOAA, as well as other veteran service organizations and advisory boards. 5 consecutive 5-Star Level of Excellence Awards. The Harris Communication Award. The NYS Intrastate Compact on the Educational Opportunities for Military Families finally passed – the very last State of the Union to do so. Jerry worked relentlessly for all veterans, no matter their status, rank, or affiliation.

Jerry was clearly a man of deep compassion and understanding, out of which came great love, service, integrity, leadership, and honesty. Great love for his God, his family, and his country. We have lost a true leader, noble patriot, an officer, and a gentleman. Heaven has welcomed home His faithful servant. Fair Winds and Following Seas, CAPT Luzum. We shall miss you.

GVC Member Awarded Bronze Star

GVC member CW2 Ryan A. Boas has been awarded the Bronze Star Medal for service after his most recent deployment to Afghanistan, which ended in Oct 2015. CW2 Boas enlisted in the Army in 2003. He rose to the rank of Sergeant First Class before graduating from Warrant Officer Candidate School and being appointed as a Warrant Officer One in Nov 2011 and advanced to CW2 in Nov 2013. He has been a member of the Genesee Valley Chapter since 2012.

CW2 Boas is currently an All-Source Intelligence Technician for the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) at Fort Campbell, Kentucky. His previous assignments include: Fort Sill, Oklahoma; Fort Sam Houston, Texas; and Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia. He has deployed twice in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom – to Camp Taji in 2005 with the 3rd Infantry Division and to Camp Cropper from 2007-

2008 as part of the Joint Interrogation and Debriefing Center. He has also deployed twice to Afghanistan – to Forward Operating Base Salerno in support of Operation Enduring Freedom from 2012-2013 and to Bagram Airfield in support of Operation Freedom's Sentinel in 2015, both with the 101st Airborne Division.

His military education includes Warrant Officer Basic Course, Warrant Officer Candidate School, Anti-Terrorism Officer Basic Course, DoD Threat Vulnerabilities Course, Foreign Disclosure Officer Course, Unit Movement Officer Course, Basic Analyst Manager's Course, Security Manager's Course, Distributed Common Ground System-Army (DCGS-A) Course, All-Source Analysis System (ASAS)-Light Basic Operator's Course, and Army Basic Instructor's Course. He received an Associate of Science Degree in Intelligence Operations with Honors from Cochise College in 2010. He has also taken numerous courses through Alfred University, Troy University, Monroe Community College, and Central Texas College, as well as received Army ROTC training from Saint Bonaventure University and Rochester Institute of Technology.

His military awards include the Bronze Star Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, Joint Meritorious Unit Award, Army Meritorious Unit Commendation with Oak Leaf Cluster, Army Achievement Medal, Army Good Conduct Medal with two Knots, National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal with two Campaign Stars, Iraq Campaign Medal with one Campaign Star, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Non-Commissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon with Numeral Three, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon with Numeral Four, NATO Medal with Bronze Star (ISAF and Afghanistan Clasps), Air Assault Badge, Drill Sergeant Identification Badge, German Armed Forces Proficiency Badge in Gold, and Norwegian Foot March Badge in Bronze (first award). Additionally, he was a General Douglas MacArthur Leadership Award nominee in 2015. He has also placed first in the "ARMY" Magazine Photo Contest, the All-Army Digital Photography Contest, the Military Officers Association of America Photo Contest, and been a finalist in the Art In Embassies Photo Contest.

CW2 Boas is the son of Keith and Carol Anne Boas, and nephew of LTC Russ Green, USA (Ret) and Kathy Green and Col Barbara Green USA (Ret).
