Ensure Tricare reform sustains top-quality care Prevent disproportional Tricare fee increases Sustain military pay comparability with the private sector

Block erosion of compensation and commissary benefits

Protect military retirement/COLAs

Sustain Wounded Warrior programs and expand caregiver support

End disabled/survivor financial penalties Fix Guard/Reserve retirement

Improve spouse and family support

Assure timely access to the VA, and eliminate the VA claims backlog.

You can read up on the specifics of each of these issues at www.moaa.org. Click on the "Take Action - Take Legislative Action" tab. Take the time (JUST 10 SECONDS!) to send an email to your

representatives in Congress to urge them to "Take Action." You can send the pre-written email off as it is, or you can easily edit and modify the body of the letter as you see fit. Your voice IS heard through these messages! And in a large way, that makes up (sort of) for the frustration of not being heard in Presidential elections.

HONOR FLIGHT ROCHESTER: The Board of Directors approved to increase the Chapter's donation amount to \$500 to Honor Flight to fund the cost of sending one veteran on an Honor Flight Mission. There 3 spring missions: 30 Apr - 1 May, 21 - 22 May, and 18-19 June.

GVC Member Profiles

This issue presents Lieutenant Colonel Russell L. Green, US Army-Ret., the GVC treasurer. Colonel Green, a Rochester native, grew up in the city's 19th Ward and Greece. A graduate of

Greece Olympia High School and Niagara University, he received a B.S. and an ROTC commission in the Signal Corps from Niagara in 1968. He then entered active duty and completed Officer's Basic and MOS training at Ft. Gordon, Georgia. Assigned to the Strategic Communications Command, Europe, he

spent a year each in Munich and Nuremburg, Germany working as a Communications Logistics Officer

Following his European assignment, Russ deployed to Vietnam, where he was assigned as the Transportation Plans Officer at the US Army Depot, DaNang. (It seems there was an excess of Signal Officers in Vietnam at this point!) The Army Depot was the central distribution point for all equipment and supplies (less ammo & fuel) entering the I Corps area (the far northern quarter of South Vietnam), and Russ was one of the officers responsible for overseeing that distribution, either by air, rail, convoy or watercraft. He was awarded the Bronze Star for conspicuous service during Operation Dewey Canyon, the US incursion into Laos in an attempt

to choke off the Ho Chi Minh Trail.

Following Vietnam, Russ was reassigned back to the Strategic Communications Command, Europe as the S-4 of the 73rd Signal Battalion in Pirmasens, Germany. Here he met and married his wife, Kathleen, who was a teacher in the DOD Dependent School System.

Leaving active duty in 1975, Russ and Kathy settled in Salt Lake City. Russ earned an MBA at the University of Utah; Kathy worked for the Salt Lake City School District. While in the MBA program, Russ learned computer programming, and then joined Kathy at the Salt Lake City School District.

In Utah, Russ joined the Army Reserve as the Communications-Electronics Officer of the 96th Army Reserve Command. After eleven years in that position, he finished his military career as an Individual Mobilization Augmentee (IMA), with four year stints with both the Department of the Army, Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics at the Pentagon, and US Army Pacific Headquarters at Ft Shafter, Hawaii.

With twenty-six years combined active and reserve service, he retired from the Army in 1994. Russ and Kathy then returned to the Rochester area. Kathy retired as the Technology Director of the Wayne Central School District, and Russ retired as a Systems Analyst for MVP Healthcare (formerly Preferred Care).

Colonel Green joined MOAA/TROA and the Genesee Valley Chapter on returning to the Rochester area twenty years ago. He served eight years as the Chapter Treasurer, and is currently the Chapter 3rd Vice President.

He and Kathleen have lived in Fairport for the past ten years. The Greens have two daughters, Christina and Angela. Christina, an Army and Afghanistan vet, obtained her teaching degree from Nazareth College and a Masters from Univ of Missouri and is currently employed by Hillside Children's Services as a Special Ed teacher. She has a seven year-old daughter, Molly. Angela received her Associates Degree in Business from MCC and a BS in Accounting from Walden Univ, and is employed by Strong Health in the Accounting Dept. She is currently working on an MBA at UR. Russ and Kathy perform with two fire department bands (Fairport & Rush). Kathy sings with the Rochester Oratorio Society, Russ fills up his time with the Knights of Columbus and the Rochester Genealogy Society.
