The price of one wreath is \$15, and are generally sold in packs of 5. The wreaths that are donated in the name of our Chapter will be placed at the Sampson Veterans Memorial Cemetery on Dec 17 at noon. There are only 325 graves, and we, along with some other groups, are already 60% of the way there, but we have only four volunteers to place the wreaths so far. ## **Surviving Spouses Aging in Place**

We are all getting older and, as we age, would like to remain in the comfort of our own homes. The best living environment for our aging selves is safe, comfortable, preserves our independence, accommodates our need for assistance, supports our lifestyle, and is affordable for a long time.

Experts delineate the most dangerous areas of our home: kitchen, bathroom, and stairs. Here are some modifications to consider:

- Ramps at home entrances and steps;
   handrails at existing steps and porches
- Remote-controlled blinds/shades plus lever-style door handles
- Adequate indoor and outdoor lighting

- Lever styles handles on faucets, pullout sprayer at sink in kitchen
- Front control cooktop and side-by-side refrigerator
- Raised dishwasher and front loading washer and dryer
- Higher toilets and easily accessible shower

When considering necessary changes for aging in place, unbiased assessments by a Certified Aging-In-Place specialist (CAPS) can identify the unique needs of an older adult.

Joe was commissioned an ROTC Air Force 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant in 1957 and was called to active duty in November of the same year. His first operational assignment was as a personnel officer at Donaldson AFB in Greenville, South Carolina. While stationed at Donaldson, Joe met and married Nancy Hagan and they were soon reassigned to Lajes Field in the Azore Islands. After two years at Lajes Field, Joe was reassigned to Air Rescue Headquarters at Orlando AFB in Florida. He left active duty in October 1962. He joined the ANG 158<sup>th</sup> Combat Support Squadron, Burlington, Vermont in 1963 as a personnel officer. Several vears later, the Ballisters relocated to Rochester and Joe joined the AFR 914th Tactical Airlift Group in Niagara Falls where he served as the public affairs officer until his retirement in 1985.
