It's a move that veterans groups say is overdue but also potentially beneficial to tens of thousands of <u>Gulf War veterans</u>. As many as 250,000 individuals who served in operations <u>Desert Shield and Desert Storm</u> in the early 1990s have reported a series of problems including joint pain, fatigue, rashes, memory issues and digestive problems, with no clear cause.

### When Do I Need a New ID Card?

DoD officials have yet to set a specific date for the complete changeover to a new, more secure type of ID card in the coming years, but retirees with "indefinite" cards of the old variety can have them replaced at their convenience.

The transition to the Next Generation Uniformed Services Identification Card began in July 2020, replacing paper-based cards with plastic ones boasting updated security features. It's set for completion in 2026.

What SECURE Act 2.0 Means for Your Retirement The SECURE Act 2.0 is now law, ushering in sweeping changes to our retirement system. Some of the more prominent changes include:

- Increasing the age to start taking required minimum distributions (RMDs).
- Lowering the penalty for missed RMDs.
- Enhancing the features, benefits, and accessibility of employer plans.
- Increasing catch-up contribution amounts.
- Doing away with RMDs from Roth accounts in employer retirement plans.
