GVC Members Participate in Honor Flight

Two GVC members participated in Honor Flight Rochester's Mission 80, Sep 30 – Oct 1, 2023. Russ Green as a veteran and Paul Cannon as a Guardian escort. They have each been gracious enough to provide a few paragraphs about their experience on HFR Mission 80!

Russ Green, Honor Flight Mission 80

The day started early, with a 4 AM check-in with Honor Flight Mission 80 at the ROC Airport. After a short flight to Baltimore, we were herded into buses for the drive to Washington. The first order of business on the bus was "mail call", where we each received a number of letters written by local school children, ranging in age from nine to seventeen. The letters were moving, and it was obvious that the kids possessed a short military bio on each of us. I have personally replied to each one I received.

Once in Washington, our first stop was the WWII Memorial. This was important for me, since I had a number of family members who were involved in many of the campaigns remembered on the memorial: Corregidor, Pearl Harbor, Mariannas, Ardennes Forest, North Africa & Sicily. Our second stop included the one of most significance to me - the Vietnam Memorial. I found the name of one college mate etched on the wall. Other memorials followed in quick succession – Lincoln, Korean War, Air Force, FDR, and Marine Memorials. The most important stop was the Tomb of the Unknown Soldiers and the changing of the guard. A moving ceremony to be sure. After this very busy day, we returned to our hotel in Baltimore for an evening reflecting, imbibing, and eating dinner.

The next morning, our return to the Rochester Airport was like the icing on the cake. Our reception "parade" through the airport and welcome home ceremony were truly moving. Even though I had experienced this once before a dozen years ago as a "Guardian", being on the receiving end of all this made it all the more important to me. Speaking of Guardians, I was escorted on this trip by my daughter, Christina, who is an Army & Afghanistan veteran. She supported me in every way on the trip and was by my side every minute. This trip is one I will not soon forget.

I was an Honor Flight Guardian for Larry Snyder on Honor Flight Mission 80. Larry was motivated to submit his application due to a recommendation from folks he drilled with in the Army Reserve, those he served with as an Honor Guard, and his wife's father who went on a previous flight. He waited about four years until he got the call to go. By the time the call came, he had relocated to Florida. After receiving the invite, he flew back to Rochester just to take the flight, and requested a local escort for the mission, and I had volunteered to be a Guardian and was contacted and that's where I come in.

Larry stated the best part of the trip was the ability to discuss service history and service memories with me, other veterans, and those supporting Honor Flight as volunteers. He said seeing the monuments was nice, but really cherished the get together after the evening dinner. He cherished the camaraderie, as many people hung around afterwards to fellowship. He was glad he did the trip and would recommend it to anyone who served.

As far as being a Guardian, I was honored to serve as a Guardian, and being a veteran myself,

also felt a similar appreciation for the mission of Honor Flight. It has motivated me to submit my name for a future flight to go with an escort, either someone who has served, or a dependent who has not. I also look forward to the afterhours personal engagement with all the other veterans and escorts. I wanted to spend time with fellow GVC member, Russ Green, who was there with his daughter, but due to the time constraints didn't even get a chance to engage.

The impact for me, especially touring the monuments, was thinking about all who have served and especially those who have given their all for this great country. All Americans, especially elected officials, owe it to veterans, living and deceased, to reflect on why the memorials are there and what they represent.

The opportunity to engage with all the mission 80 veterans, and their escorts sharing their own appreciation for the mission was rewarding, as were the welcome home activities at the Rochester airport. I think many of those veterans that have served probably didn't get the homecoming welcoming activities that we all experienced that day at the airport, it was truly moving.

Finally, as small as the veteran community is here in Rochester, it is not uncommon to bump into other veterans that have either served, or volunteered to support Honor Flight, and that in and of itself, was also rewarding to know we are a "connected" group.

Governor Hochul Celebrates Federal Funding Award for New York's First State Veterans Cemetery

(29 Sep 2023 Press Release Extract)

- NYS Veterans Cemetery Finger Lakes Came Under State Ownership in February 2023
- National Cemetery Administration to Provide \$3.951M for Expansion and Improvements

Governor Kathy Hochul today announced the award of nearly \$4 million in federal funding to support expansion and improvement projects at the New York State Veterans Cemetery - Finger Lakes, the first veterans cemetery owned and operated by New York State. This builds on the Governor's announcement of the formal establishment of the State cemetery in February 2023, and marks an important milestone that will help ensure the State can provide dignified burial options for New York's veterans and their families for generations to come.

"Our veterans give so much for us, it is only right they have a dedicated, dignified space to rest," Governor Hochul said. "The establishment of this cemetery is a proud achievement of my administration, and I am thankful for my partners who have made this possible. This federal funding will ensure the cemetery is maintained to the highest standards as it so rightfully should."

Overseen by the New York State Department of Veterans' Services, the New York State Veterans Cemetery - Finger Lakes occupies 162 acres along Seneca Lake in Romulus, Seneca County and is adjacent to Sampson State Park. The site has 147 acres of land available for development and construction projects to ensure it serves as an honored resting place for New York State's heroes for generations to come. The Cemetery is located at the site of the former Sampson Naval Training Station and Sampson Air Force Base, where hundreds of thousands of service members trained during World War II and the Korean War. The site later functioned as a temporary college and a separation center for service members being discharged, officially closed in 2000. The Cemetery is located near Waterloo. the community recognized as the birthplace of Memorial Day.

Changing Medicare Plans

MOAA Military Officer Magazine (MOM) Extract, November 2023, Capt. Paul J. Frost, AFC®, USN (Ret) and Karen Ruedisueli.

If you want to change your Medicare plan, you can do so in the appropriate Medicare open season: (OM = Original Medicare)

Oct 15 through Dec 7 is for OM enrollees who want to switch to an Advantage plan or join OM from an Advantage plan. New plans start Jan. 1.

Jan 1 through Mar 31 is for Advantage plan members who want to switch Advantage plans or join OM. The new plan starts the next month after the company processes the request.

If your income drops because of a change such as divorce, retirement, death, you can appeal your income level and Part B premium amount.
